

MISSION AND VALUES

Edgewood is a Catholic co-educational school founded in 1881 by the Congregation of the Dominican Sisters of Sinsinawa. Edgewood educates the whole student for a lifetime of learning, service and personal responsibility through a rigorous curriculum based in the values of truth, compassion, justice, partnership and community. Enrollment is open to students regardless of educational or religious background. The curriculum is college preparatory. The class schedule is a modified modular system, providing flexibility and promoting independent learning.

CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY

Edgewood High School lies on the shores of Lake Wingra alongside its sister elementary school and college. The University of Wisconsin is located several blocks away. Madison is Wisconsin's capital, with a population of 240,000 and nearly 540,000 including the greater metro area. It is surrounded by four lakes and many parks and prairies. Madison has much to offer as a political, medical, educational and business center. Government employees, professors, health care workers, private researchers, engineering and biotechnology specialists, and insurance and financial professionals comprise a majority of the workforce.

In 2007 Edgewood was rated first among 21 Madison-area high schools by *Madison Magazine* based on academic outcomes and its academic and cultural environment.
